Headline: At risk at ones life.

The suspects in the robbery-case put their lives at risk to help in the 3. world, says one of their theoretical teachers.

While whole of the danish leftwing had been busy dissociate themselves from the suspects in the great robberycase, they are still being met with a mixture of admiration and shaking of ones head from certain other people.

"I do admire this little group of socialists in Denmark. Because they toke out and struggled side by side with the revolutionaries in the 3. world. They put their own lives at risk."

The words are being said by one of the most discussed economists in the western world, the 78-ageed Arghiri Emmanuel, author to a number of books and articles on the contradiction between the industrialised countries and the underdeveloped world.

At the same time he is the theoretical background for the group, which is now in prison in Copenhagen, charged for robbery, manslaughter (the group is charged for the killing of a policeman in the lastest robbery for which they have been charged) and support to what the police says is a terrorist organisation (the PFLP!!!)

The publishing house Manifest, which is owned by members of the Communist Working Group, has published several of the books by Arghiri Emmanuel in Denmark, just as he has written the foreword to the manifesto of the Communist Working Group: "Imperialism today."

Several members of the Communist Working Group met with Arghiri Emmanuel in his university-office in Paris in the beginning of the 80^ts, and since then the group and him have had regular correspondence.

For Emmanuel the meeting with the danish group was unforgettable. Yesterday he told "Aktuelt":

"Time and time again I have been asked, what can revolutionary socialists do to support the revolution in the 3. world. Actually my answer have always been plain:

Nothing at all. I haven't been able to give a reel answer. But the danish group gave me the answer. They were ready to go out and fight side by side with the revolutionaries in the 3. world. They told me, they have been many places, specially in Africa.

I didnt have the right to ask them for details, but I know that they have put their lives at risk. And I couldnt anything else than be full of admiration." says Emmanuel.

It is madness.

Until yesterday he knew nothing about his danish political comrades are prisoned, and are charghed for a number of armed robberies of which the haul should have been sent to the PFLP.

"It is impossible. But if it is true anyway, it is madness no more no less. It is a hopeless, harmfull idea to robe banks in West-europe and send the money to liberation movements in Africa. And I cant believe, they have done it." says Emmanuel.

Emmanuel is the modern interpreter of the superprofittheory, which among other things states, that the workingclass in West-europe is corrupted by tiled bathrooms, charter-holidays and single-family houses. The struggle against imperialism has to be won in the underdeveloped world.

The other answer.

According to his theory it means that revolutioary socialiste can do nothing in West-europe.

"Beyond to write books and articles about the situation in the underdeveloped world." says Emmanuel.

"But my danish friends gave an other answer. Beside selling used clothes and get peanuts, they said one could go one step further. Namely struggle side by side with the revolutionaries in the 3. world. When I met them here in Paris, they told me, they already had been many places. But it was specially Africa, they spoke about."

And it wasn't just a question about selling used clothes? "No. During the conversation I get the clear impression, they several times had put their lives at risk, but it was not as bank-robbers in Denmark." says Emmanuel.
